The Rockhampton Grammar School

Established in 1881, The Rockhampton Grammar School (RGS) is one of the oldest schools in Australia. An independent, co-educational school and Queensland's largest boarding school, RGS offers an Early Learning to Year 12 educational journey. As Central Queensland's best performing school for academic excellence, RGS also offers a huge range of co-curricular activities including sport, music, dance, agriculture, outdoor education and much more.

The extensive on-site facilities provide plenty of opportunities for all students to participate. Participation from everyone is central to a successful school, regardless of ability or experience. Students make full use of an indoor gymnasium, two sporting ovals, indoor multipurpose hall, dance studios, theatre, music rooms, undercover arena, outdoor Olympic size swimming pool, four tennis and six netball courts, a beach volleyball court and cricket nets. For the rugby union & rugby league programs, activities take place at the impressive Rugby Park complex at The Range.

Rugby Union is available to Secondary students, boys & girls. The inter-school competition for girls is in Term 1 (boys and girls). The First XV and U15 Boys compete at the Ballymore Cup in April school holidays.

Rugby League is available to Primary (Friday afternoon sport) and Secondary students (boys and girls). The inter-school competition for girls is Term 2 and for boys in Term 3. The First XIII and U15 Boys participate in the Dolphin's Cup in Terms 2 and 3 and the First XIII in the Confraternity Shield during the July school holidays.

About Rockhampton

Rockhampton is a city that's all about liveability, with affordable country living and all the big city advantages, river and mountain views, a thirty-minute drive to the coast, and an easy commute to work - all in one place.

Rockhampton is heart of the Fitzroy Basin, Australia's second largest river system, bordered by the Berserker Ranges in Mt Archer National Park, and just a short distance away from the Southern Great Barrier Reef, some of Queensland's great beaches are right on the doorstep.

Head of Rugby (Union & League)

The Head of Rugby (Union & League) must be passionate about the development of school rugby union & rugby league. The main functions of the role are to support and encourage participation in rugby union & rugby league at RGS, through leading staff and students in representing the School positively, to develop the skills of every member in an effort to reach excellence and provide members with opportunities to progress in the sport during and beyond RGS.

This position is offered as either a teaching or non-teaching role. If the successful applicant is offered the position as a teaching role, a reduced teaching load will be assigned specific to the experienced teaching area of the candidate.

The Head of Rugby (Union & League) is a full-time, permanent position, working 38 hours per week with a requirement to work 44 weeks per year, and has autonomy to oversee all aspects of the school rugby union & rugby league program. The role is responsible and accountable for the performance of the programs and their members. The role reports to the Director of Co-Curriculum and is well supported by the Sports Administrator, Sports Registrar and Parent Support Group. There are professional development opportunities within the role to further advance their skills. The School looks to liaise and develop relationships with elite rugby union & rugby league organisations.

To be considered for this role you will have significant rugby union and/or rugby league experience, either as a coach, athlete or administrator, ideally producing successful results with school-aged athletes. Your excellent planning, organisational and interpersonal communication skills will allow you to form effective working relationships with athletes, their coaches and parents.

This role presents a unique opportunity to make a positive impact on the success of young rugby union & rugby league players both on and off the field at one of Queensland's leading schools.



Key Responsibilities

Representing the School

- Communicating the vision and purpose of RGS Rugby Union & Rugby League effectively
- Developing and maintaining close and positive relationships with local Rugby Union & Rugby League Associations
- Attending Parent Support Group monthly meetings and leading conversations about RGS Rugby Union & Rugby League

Ensure RGS Rugby Union/Rugby League is managed productively

- Leading the coaches, referees, players and volunteers in working to meet the goals, future direction and priorities of RGS Rugby Union / Rugby League programs
- Organisation and delegation of tasks to administrators, coaches, parents or players
- Creating and actively maintaining a positive rugby union & rugby league culture

Management

- Sourcing, allocating and supporting coaches to appropriate teams
- Organising / facilitating competitions whether they be weekly, stand-alone carnivals, or tours
- Assisting with behaviour management of players, parents, and other team's in support of members

Communication

- Working with the marketing department to publish communications on a range of media including Facebook, emails, notices and assemblies to enhance knowledge of rugby union & rugby league happenings
- Working closely with Director of Co-curricular, Sports Registrar, Sports Administrator and other Teachers in Charge (TIC's) and staff

Development

- Designing, developing and reflecting on programs using research and up-to-date information that is in-line with relevant peak sporting bodies at local, State and national levels
- Coordinating programs designed to improve skills of members in every area (coaching, refereeing, volunteering, playing)
- Collecting, formulating and providing feedback to members, to assist in the effectiveness of programs
- Managing talent identification programs that encourage the development and selection of holistic athletes
- Liaising with auxiliary staff to support the development of athletes in a range of areas (nutrition, mental health and fitness)
- Working with coaches in rugby union & rugby league across all grades

Other duties as the Director of Co-Curriculum may reasonably require from time to time.

Safeguarding Children and Young People

Mandatory Requirements

- Ability to work as a member of a team as well as autonomously
- Current Full Driver's License
- Satisfactory Criminal Records Check
- (In case of a Teacher) Registered with Queensland College of Teachers (QCT) alternatively (in case of non-teaching) a current Police Check and Blue Card (Working with Children Check)
- Willingness to complete the Safeguarding Children Online Training Certificate
- Commitment to a Child Safe environment and the school's Practice and Behaviour Guidelines
- Willingness to support the ethos and values of the School

Residency & Immigration

Candidates must be an Australian Citizen / Permanent Resident or have unlimited working rights within Australia to be considered for this position.

Hours of Work

The Head of Rugby (Union & League) role is a fulltime, permanent position, working 38 hours per week with a requirement to work 44 weeks per year.

Due to the nature of the role, flexible hours will be required to oversee all aspects of the rugby union and rugby league programs, including some evening and weekend work.

There would be some expectation of work in school holiday time including at the start of the year to prepare for the season and week-long carnivals in the middle of the year.

Location and Travel

The position is based at The Rockhampton Grammar School, Archer Street, Rockhampton.

A small amount of travel throughout the district and wider Queensland may be required to attend various programs and events.

Remuneration Guide

Remuneration is negotiable dependent upon qualifications and experience as per the RGS EBA. At the time of applying, candidates are invited to indicate their current salary and salary expectations.

Additional benefits include staff meals (morning tea and lunch), wellbeing services such as staff yoga and gym sessions, career and professional development opportunities, uniform allowances, access to School facilities and salary packaging options.
